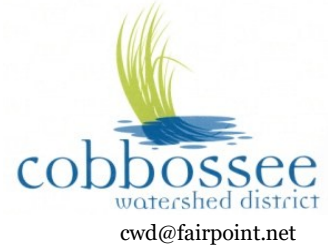


WATER LEVELS STATUS REPORT

THROUGH JUNE 25, 2026



PRECIPITATION *measured at CWD office in Winthrop:*

April total	3.59 inches
May total	4.56 inches
June so far:	2.66 inches

April precipitation (as measured at CWD in Winthrop) was approximately half an inch below average, and May precipitation was approximately 3/4 of an inch above average. June precipitation is trending below average. The drought status in the Cobbossee Watershed has improved and moved out of drought into the “abnormally dry” category.

Lake Levels

Summer water level management goals are to start with a full pond and minimize seasonal water loss from evaporation by minimizing water discharges and dam leakage, resulting in only a gradual lowering of water levels throughout the summer. Last year's drought made it difficult to maintain desired levels.

Lakes are at or near full pond levels now. The variation ranges from 5 inches below full pond at Narrows Ponds, where there is no dam to control the level, to 3 inches above at Berry/Dexter/Wilson Ponds. We will be watching those that are slightly above full and ask dam operators to open more if necessary, if water keeps rising. The five ponds of the Tacoma Lakes, and Torsey Pond, were exactly at full pond as of June 24th.
